**FROM THE GREENKEEPER**

Well it's March already and the Masters at Augusta just around the corner. I mention this as I have just seen a picture taken only last week- the course there is covered in snow and frost too! All the winter projects at our club are now finished. We rode our luck with the weather, now what we need is some wet and warm weather as this will help the newly laid turf to knit better. I am hoping to have the bunkers sanded up by either the first or second week in April. As stated in the January Newsletter please play the alterations for a full season before making judgments so that we can get a wider view point on how the changes play. During the next couple of weeks we will (again weather permitting) be pencil tining the greens followed by an application of wetting agent. The pencil tining opens the sward (remembering that grass needs air to breathe just like you and me) the wetting agent serves two purposes – firstly it draws excess water from the surface and then it also manages to help retain moisture in the soil where the roots can get the nutrients it requires. These two jobs are very important in the long term upkeep of the putting surfaces.
