

Cartrefi Conwy supports celebration of Llanrwst Almshouses

Cartrefi Conwy is supporting the celebrations on the 29th May, commemorating the 400th anniversary of the Llanrwst Almshouses by making a £1,000 donation.

The Llanrwst Almshouses were closed in 1976 after they were pronounced unfit for habitation. After lying empty for twenty years restoration commenced in 1997 and was completed in 1999, when the buildings were fitted out as a community Museum. The Llanrwst Almshouse Museum is run as a community Museum, promoting the heritage of the building, the local area and it's inhabitants. The Museum also hosts a temporary exhibition and events program and many educational resources working closely with other local community groups.

Cartrefi Conwy is pleased to be able to support such a valuable community resource and event such as the Llanrwst 400 years Celebration Fund.
