

Directions

From the A55 Expressway Westbound, take Junction 8, the exit for the A5025, signposted Benllech and Amlwch. Follow this road for 1 mile, and go straight across the roundabout (Four Crosses Pub on Left). Carry on this road, through the village of Pentraeth and on for a further half a mile until you see a sign for a turning on your right which is sign posted Red Wharf Bay, turn right here and follow the road which runs parallel with the main road you have just turned off.

When you see the Oriel Coast Gallery on your right and the disused hotel go straight on, rather than following the road round to the left. After approximately half a mile you will see the sign for St. David's Park on your left. Go through the gateposts, swipe your card at the barrier intercom (if you do not have a barrier card please press the button for St. David's Park) and follow our private road to the end. There are several speed bumps throughout the park.

At the mini roundabout take the first exit left up towards the reception block where disabled parking is available.

St. David's Park

The caravan park is generally on the level ground and access to the office, shop and launderette, from the car park, is in on the level with ramped access to The Tavern 1924.

The caravan park is not served directly by public transport, the nearest main line bus and train stations are at Bangor and Holyhead.

There is clear signage throughout the caravan park pointing out reception, The Tavern 1924, numbered fields and facilities.

The caravan park does have a small shop on site selling general provisions, with the nearest supermarket 7 miles away in Bangor where you will find a full range of shops and supermarkets. The village of Benllech is situated approximately 1 mile from the park and there you will find a Pharmacy, Post Office and small supply shops.

The caravan park does have a newly refurbished gastro pub on site, The Tavern 1924, which has a ramped access and disabled facilities.

There are several skips placed throughout the caravan park for rubbish disposal.

Caravans and Lodges are privately owned on site, with the exception of two hire lodges which are rented out on a weekly basis. There are 6 steps up to the hire lodges and they are surrounded by an open decked area. The hire lodges cater for up to 4 adults and 2 children, with one double room, a twin room and a child's twin room with two 2'6" beds.

The caravan park also accommodates touring caravans and tents, which are all soft standing pitches on two fields which can be accessed by car, again with several speed bumps. Parts of the access roads have uneven surfaces. They are facilitated by a ladies and gentlemen's shower and toilet room, family bathroom and disabled room, all accessed on the level ground.

The caravan park also offers residents the facility of a boat park, which is a designated secure area and boats are only moved off and on this area to be launched into the water and brought back onto their pitches.

The park also has a clearly signed private beach area which is accessed through the main car park and dunes by a slightly sloping narrow path.
